



2018 COMPETITION REGULATIONS

FOR INTERNATIONAL ICE CLIMBING COMPETITIONS

Summary of modifications made to the 2018 Competition Regulations for International Ice Climbing Competitions as agreed by the UIAA Ice Climbing Commission

4.1.8.3 c)	In case of a Technical Incident, the athlete must decide immediately whether he wants to start climbing again right away, or prefers resting time. The Jury President decides on the length of the allotted resting time.
4.2.4.3	There will be no more one-minute-call during lead attempts.
4.2.5.2 d)	In order to get 0.001 an athlete needs to simply touch the hold.
4.3.5.2 e)	Only one (1) false start per athlete and event is allowed; a 2 nd false start means "finished attempt"
4.3.5.2 f)	The new attempt limit of speed routes is 60 seconds; those who do not make it are called down and receive the result of "Did not finish" (DNF).
	This season, last year's rule change of New Ice Box dimensions (25 x 50 cm) is enforced.
4.3.6.1	In single route speed competitions only 16 competitors shall be in the finals (instead of 18).
4.3.6.4.4	There now are only two (2) attempts in qualifications of single route speed competitions.
4.3.6.4.5	There now are three (3) attempts in finals of single route speed competitions.
5.1.7.1	There now are quotas for World Cups per discipline: National team quota of non-hosting country: 8 female and 8 male National team quota of hosting country: 16 female and 16 male Additionally, also the winner of the Overall World Cup of the previous season
5.2.2.1	The quotas for World Championships per discipline are amended to: National team quota of non-hosting country: 8 female and 8 male National team quota of hosting country: 16 female and 16 male Additionally, also the previous world champion
5.3.3.1	The quotas for World Youth Championships per discipline and category are amended to: National team quota of non-hosting country: 6 female and 6 male National team quota of hosting country: 12 female and 12 male Additionally also 3 best placed competitors from previous year's World Youth Championship
